#### **CLASS UPDATE**

#### **Church Cove**

Church Cove class have been very busy since the start of the Summer term. We started off by inquiring into our topic 'Cornwall My Home' and drawing comparisons between Cornwall and southern Australia. We even managed to explore Australian zoos on Google Earth!

Last week, we went on school camp in Okehampton. We completed activities such as abseiling, weaselling, archery, climbing walls, obstacle courses and team games. The class had a wonderful time with Germoe and we represented both schools brilliantly.

In English, we have been writing diaries about our time at camp, which we are now publishing in class. In Maths, we have been learning about shapes, angles and co-ordinates. We have started to explore what we know and what we wonder about Cornwall and Australia, as well as the physical geography of both areas of the world.

We were also very lucky to welcome lifeguards from the RNLI to the school this week, to host an assembly about beach safety.







#### **ECO CLUB**

We started our session by watching a film about a conservationist in Japan who was distressed to find hermit crabs were using discarded plastic instead of natural shells. He now tries to replace their plastic shells with natural shells. We identified 2 problems here:

- 1. There is too much plastic waste produced by humans.
- 2. Humans have taken too many shells from the beach, leaving the crabs forced to find alternatives.

We decided we can all do our part by using less single use plastic and thinking very carefully before we collect shells from the beaches.

We completed a litter pick, finding more this week, as you can see from the photo, although we did venture into the car park for this extra haul. Some of it was valuable resources that we can clean and reuse.

We finished by planting some donated strawberry plants. Thank you to our kind donor. We now have more edible plants that will also attract pollinators with their flowers, increasing biodiversity!

#### **HOUSEHOLD SUPPORT FUND**

The entitlement criteria for automatic payments from the Household Support Fund is changing.

To be entitled to a payment from the Household Support Fund in 2024, you must be responsible for at least one child and on 3rd June 2024 either:

- be entitled to Council Tax Support or
- have been placed in emergency accommodation by the Council

You will receive £80 per child. If you are already in receipt of Council Tax Support, then you will receive your payment automatically.

It is important that you submit your application by 31st May 2024.



#### Why have we made this change?

Because entitlement to Free school meals has been protected since 2018, parents of children entitled to free school meals aren't always still on a low income. By using Council Tax Support data, we can ensure that the Household Support Fund is going to parents who currently have a low income and are struggling with the increased costs of running their home. By better targeting the awards, we are able to help families with children of any age, rather than just school age children.

Families of children in receipt of free school meals can still access help through the Time2Move holiday programme. This scheme offers fun physical activities, games and wider activities plus a meal for all children during the main school holiday periods.



## SCHOOL CLOSURES IN EMERGENCY – AGREED NOTIFICATION PROCEDURE

Please see the attached guidance from Cornwall Council. Sometimes schools have to make the decision to close either partially or fully due to inclement weather such as snow or other unforeseen circumstances. The procedures are revised annually.

The agreed notification Procedure for our school is:

- 1) We will inform Cornwall Council so they can update their website
- 2) We will inform local radio stations (BBC Radio Cornwall, Goldmine FM, Heart FM, Pirate FM) so they can make announcements and update their websites
  - 3) We will post on our Facebook pages, "The Federation of Boskenwyn and Germoe School," "Boskenwyn FOBS" and "Germoe FROGS"

If you wake up to a blanket of snow in the near future then please make sure you check one or more of the above places to keep up to date with school closures, it may be that we open later or close earlier so you will need to check before coming to school. If the school needs to close whilst the children are there then we will contact all parents via phone.



## School emergency closures

#### A guide for parents / carers

We recognise that the decision to close a school in the event of an emergency (eg snow, flooding, no water or heating) significantly impacts upon you, as parents / carers. This guide outlines the agreed procedure which all schools are asked to follow and offers advice to parents / carers on the key things to consider, both before and after the decision to close has been made.

#### **Guidance given to schools**

Guidance and procedures are sent to all schools on an annual basis, usually at the start of the autumn term. To prevent the possibility of fraudulent school closures, schools are required to follow a verification process before providing school closure information. Schools are then asked to:

Undertake a risk assessment, using common sense to determine whether it is feasible for children and staff to remain in the school; and if not, what subsequent risks could arise by sending them home. Before school hours start, schools are also asked to assess if the roads are safe for children to travel to school.

Seek approval from the Governing Board (usually the decision of the Chair of Governors will suffice) to authorise the decision to close.

Notify Cornwall Council and the local radio stations (BBC Radio Cornwall, Goldmine FM, Heart FM and Pirate FM). Providing the school follow the agreed procedure, each of the radio stations have all agreed to broadcast details of all school closures.

#### Know your school's procedure

Although schools are asked to follow this procedure, schools will have their own plan of action to be followed in the event of a closure. This should include details of how parents will be notified (eg via radio, text message, social media, etc). It is essential that schools communicate their plan to all parents as early as possible, and equally that all parents familiarise themselves with the agreed plan.

#### Who to contact

If the decision is made to close, you will be notified by the school's agreed notification procedure. Should you need to contact the school directly, please be aware that the line(s) may be busy or unavailable when a large number of parents are calling at the same time.
