MESSAGE FROM MISS BLACKBURN

Dear parents and carers

Thank you to those who came to the parent coffee morning and to those who sent in questions even though they couldn't make it in person. Here are some of the notes and actions:

Playground - I have spoken to Mrs Nic who is now dealing with the playground markings and she is going to get a price for a chequer/chess board to go with the pitch markings. She will also look into some large chess pieces and counters. We are waiting for an installation date for the larger equipment which will go onto the grass. Unfortunately, we can't have the amount of equipment on the grass as we had before due to the depth of the new sewage system so we are extending a little onto the playground instead. I will keep you updated.

Linda is organising the plaque for **Sam's pergola** which is situated outside Mrs Nic's outdoor shelter.

Mrs Nic is tasking some of her children to **survey the play equipment**, they will then help with the ordering of replacement equipment – this will give them ownership and hopefully help them respect and look after the equipment more.

Mr Conway is sorting through the **PE questionnaire results**. He did say that parents were asking for more PE but unfortunately this isn't possible as we have a set curriculum. We do, however, include active learning in other areas and try to keep the children as active as possible. There will be a few missed sessions on the lead up to Christmas but the children will still be active with extra breaks between play practices and active drama!

A parent asked about **Mr Hemsley's blinds** being shut. Mr Hemsley assured me that they are open for the majority of the day. He purposefully closes them at the beginning and end of the school day so that the children don't get distracted or unsettled by the coming and going of parents and carers.

SWISS STUDENTS - HOST FAMILIES REQUIRED

Last summer we successfully hosted 3 Swiss Students at Boskenwyn school. In previous years, we have hosted more than this.

The children really enjoy having the Students present in their classes, and the Students have a fabulous time both at the school, and with their host families.

This year, we will be hosting our Swiss students from Sunday 21st June to Saturday 4th July 2026..

Host families receive £350 per student. For that, you will need to provide accommodation, all their meals, bring them to school and pick them up each day. (We are happy to send more than one student to the same family and the students can share a bedroom). The students are all CRB checked and they can provide proof of this. The students will be aged around 17-18 years old. They are German speaking and they all speak excellent French and English.

They are looking to accommodate 160 students this year – so every place is gratefully accepted!





SCHOOL CLOSURES IN EMERGENCY – AGREED NOTIFICATION PROCEDURE

Please see the attached guidance from Cornwall Council. Sometimes schools have to make the decision to close either partially or fully due to inclement weather such as snow or other unforeseen circumstances. The procedures are revised annually.

The agreed notification Procedure for our school is:

- 1) We will inform Cornwall Council so they can update their website
- 2) We will inform local radio stations (BBC Radio Cornwall, Goldmine FM, Heart FM, Pirate FM) so they can make announcements and update their websites
 - 3) We will post on our Facebook pages, "The Federation of Boskenwyn and Germoe School," "Boskenwyn FOBS" and "Germoe FROGS"

If you wake up to a blanket of snow in the near future then please make sure you check one or more of the above places to keep up to date with school closures, it may be that we open later or close earlier so you will need to check before coming to school. If the school needs to close whilst the children are there then we will contact all parents via phone.



School emergency closures

A guide for parents / carers

We recognise that the decision to close a school in the event of an emergency (eg snow, flooding, no water or heating) significantly impacts upon you, as parents / carers. This guide outlines the agreed procedure which all schools are asked to follow and offers advice to parents / carers on the key things to consider, both before and after the decision to close has been made.

Guidance given to schools

Guidance and procedures are sent to all schools on an annual basis, usually at the start of the autumn term. To prevent the possibility of fraudulent school closures, schools are required to follow a verification process before providing school closure information. Schools are then asked to:

Undertake a risk assessment, using common sense to determine whether it is feasible for children and staff to remain in the school: and if not, what subsequent risks could arise by sending them home. Before school hours start, schools are also asked to assess if the roads are safe for children to travel to school.

Seek approval from the Governing Board (usually the decision of the Chair of Governors will suffice) to authorise the decision to close.

Notify Cornwall Council and the local radio stations (BBC Radio Cornwall, Goldmine FM, Heart FM and Pirate FM). Providing the school follow the agreed procedure, each of the radio stations have all agreed to broadcast details of all school closures.

Know your school's procedure

Although schools are asked to follow this procedure, schools will have their own plan of action to be followed in the event of a closure. This should include details of how parents will be notified (eg via radio, text message, social media, etc). It is essential that schools communicate their plan to all parents as early as possible, and equally that all parents familiarise themselves with the agreed plan.

Who to contact

If the decision is made to close, you will be notified by the school's agreed notification procedure. Should you need to contact the school directly, please be aware that the line(s) may be busy or unavailable when a large number of parents are calling at the same time.
