MESSAGE FROM MISS BLACKBURN

Dear parents and carers

I had meeting with our assigned Attendance Officer last week. Each school has an Attendance Officer assigned to them to check that the school is tackling any persistent absence and that they are issuing penalty notices to those who have 10 sessions (5 days) of unauthorised attendance.

We do have an authorised absence request form which must be used if you are applying to take your child out during term time. These absences will only be granted under exceptional circumstances which are stated on the request form. This was discussed at our governors' meeting last night and we have decided that in future, any authorised absences will need to be approved by governors. Therefore, if you are requesting to take your child out in term time, please make sure that the request is made at least 4 weeks before the intended absence. We understand that this may not be possible in some circumstances, such as a funeral or a competition. You will be notified of the outcome of the request once approved by governors, if you take your child out without prior permission then the absence will be unauthorised and may result in a penalty notice.

Unfortunately, we do have many families who have persistent absence; persistent absence is less than 90% attendance, equating to half a day per week. These families will receive a letter this week to notify them of their child's attendance figure. We know and understand that illness can not be helped but we still need to send the letter to inform you of their current attendance figure and will need to request medical evidence if the attendance does not improve. I urge you to see this as a supportive letter and an offer of help if needed.

MESSAGE FROM MISS BLACKBURN CONTINUED

Families who regularly arrive late will also receive a letter to explain the detrimental effect this has on their children and how these lates may lead to unauthorised absences if they do not improve. Again, 10 sessions of unauthorised absence will lead to a penalty notice so we really do want to help you to prevent this from happening. We have a duty of care to your child and we have to follow the government's statutory policies and procedures. We understand that isolated lateness cannot be avoided but regular lateness can.

Persistent absence and lateness not only affects your child, their wellbeing and the academic achievement but it also has a detrimental effect on the whole school and could result in a poor Ofsted grading. Please help us to improve, we are always here to listen and support.


THANKS TO CORNISH TEA AND COFFEE

SCHOOL CLOSURES IN EMERGENCY – AGREED NOTIFICATION PROCEDURE

Please see the attached guidance from Cornwall Council. Sometimes schools have to make the decision to close either partially or fully due to inclement weather such as snow or other unforeseen circumstances. The procedures are revised annually.

The agreed notification Procedure for our school is:

- 1) We will inform Cornwall Council so they can update their website
- 2) We will inform local radio stations (BBC Radio Cornwall, Goldmine FM, Heart FM, Pirate FM) so they can make announcements and update their websites
 - 3) We will post on our Facebook pages, "The Federation of Boskenwyn and Germoe School," "Boskenwyn FOBS" and "Germoe FROGS"

If you wake up to a blanket of snow in the near future then please make sure you check one or more of the above places to keep up to date with school closures, it may be that we open later or close earlier so you will need to check before coming to school. If the school needs to close whilst the children are there then we will contact all parents via phone.



School emergency closures

A guide for parents / carers

We recognise that the decision to close a school in the event of an emergency (eg snow, flooding, no water or heating) significantly impacts upon you, as parents / carers. This guide outlines the agreed procedure which all schools are asked to follow and offers advice to parents / carers on the key things to consider, both before and after the decision to close has been made.

Guidance given to schools

Guidance and procedures are sent to all schools on an annual basis, usually at the start of the autumn term. To prevent the possibility of fraudulent school closures, schools are required to follow a verification process before providing school closure information. Schools are then asked to:

Undertake a risk assessment, using common sense to determine whether it is feasible for children and staff to remain in the school: and if not, what subsequent risks could arise by sending them home. Before school hours start, schools are also asked to assess if the roads are safe for children to travel to school.

Seek approval from the Governing Board (usually the decision of the Chair of Governors will suffice) to authorise the decision to close.

Notify Cornwall Council and the local radio stations (BBC Radio Cornwall, Goldmine FM, Heart FM and Pirate FM). Providing the school follow the agreed procedure, each of the radio stations have all agreed to broadcast details of all school closures.

Know your school's procedure

Although schools are asked to follow this procedure, schools will have their own plan of action to be followed in the event of a closure. This should include details of how parents will be notified (eg via radio, text message, social media, etc). It is essential that schools communicate their plan to all parents as early as possible, and equally that all parents familiarise themselves with the agreed plan.

Who to contact

If the decision is made to close, you will be notified by the school's agreed notification procedure. Should you need to contact the school directly, please be aware that the line(s) may be busy or unavailable when a large number of parents are calling at the same time.
