8.	<p><b>ATTENDANCE</b> Punctuality and attendance flagged as poor especially at Boskenwyn in the younger classes. Attendance policy to be reviewed at next meeting.</p> <p>Panel discussed possibility of creating a communal space that pupils can use before school similar to the ‘Piazas’ experienced on the school trip to Italy. Concerns raised that property could get destroyed and pupils may not be respectful of the space – to be discussed at next parent governor meeting.</p> <p>New OFSTED behaviour and attendance requirements to be flagged to parents in line with the school ethos – next parent governor meeting.</p> <p>Concerns raised over pupils routinely not wearing the uniform or the school colours. Panel discussed how to address this and agreed the policy will be explained to parents. Both schools are flexible with the uniform to allow expression of individuals but students are expected to wear the school colours as a minimum.</p> <p>Flexi schooling data currently being processed does not reflect this to be a positive scheme.
